Greetings to all our NASHI family who are supporting us. We are thousands of kilometers from you but you are always in our hearts. Today, we are also hundreds of kilometers from our home in Ukraine. We made a difficult decision to leave our home, the Maple Leaf House, because of the war. We feared for the safety of our girls. In the first days of the crisis, they were afraid to go to sleep and were not eating. They have already experienced enough trauma in their short lives and we made a decision to go to Poland. Within a week they were enrolled in the village school meanwhile the girls are also taking long distance classes from their school in Ukraine. They are being kept busy, remain healthy, but eager to return to their home in Ukraine.

It is difficult to explain in words how happy we are to be part of the NASHI family. Hopefully someday you will be able to come and visit us in Ukraine. We will welcome you with hugs. Maria Bilas Translated by her daughter Olena

Victor Malarek – Guest Speaker at Perogy Paradise 15



For several weeks, NASHI volunteers in Saskatoon gathered to pinch perogies in anticipation of Perogy Paradise finally returning after a two-year absence due to strict Covid restrictions. They pinched 14,000 assorted perogies: potato and cheese (my favorite), cottage cheese, buckwheat and mushroom, and Mexican! Then when word got out that NASHI was given the green light to hold its annual Perogy Paradise, tickets for the event sold out in 5 days, and on a warm Spring evening on April 30th, 450 hungry men, women and children hit the food line, passing a sweet table of beautifully decorated cupcakes and enough pies to feed a battalion. Once everyone had eaten their fill, they sat back and listened to the update about what has been happening to NASHI'S girls. A hushed audience was told that two weeks after Russian soldiers invaded Ukraine, the decision was made to move the girls from the Maple Leaf House in the farm village of Stoyaniw to a safe haven in Poland.

A video of the girls was played in which thanked the NASHI volunteers and supporters. The girls said they had only one wish. They wanted to go home to the Maple Leaf House. They missed their home. It was touching and very emotional for many people in the audience.

I had the honor of being asked to speak at the event. Inspiration was the message I wanted to bring to the event. "Inspiration is what keeps the spirit alive. We should all be inspired by the men and women who have volunteered to defend Ukraine from the barbarous invading Russian army."

I also took the time to honor the amazing work of the volunteers of NASHI. "I see the incredible amount of good they have done

with the construction of the Maple Leaf House. They created a safe haven for these 17 destitute girls. And they did this One Perogy at a Time. NASHI rescued these girls and have given them a chance at a happy and safe life."



After my presentation, Perogy Paradise took on a festive air with an auction led by Eric Schmaltz, an exuberate, energy filled auctioneer who had the place hopping with frenzied bidding wars for an amazing array of donated items. Perogy Paradise was a truly an uplifting and inspirational event. And now NASHI is back at work planning next year's Perogy Paradise. *Victor Malarek*

UPDATE FROM POLAND AND UKRAINE

The atrocities in Ukraine continue.

Our 17 NASHI girls from the Maple Leaf House are safe in Poland and are enrolled in the school in Gladyszow. This village is south-east of Krakow near the Slovakian border.

The people of this village have embraced our girls as their own. We have expanded the NASHI family to include all these Polish people who are assisting our girls to adjust to their new temporary home.



WHAT IS HAPPENING AT THE MAPLE LEAF HOUSE IN UKRAINE?

We have opened the doors of the Maple Leaf House to people from eastern Ukraine as they journey into Poland or another European country. NASHI is also supplying blankets, some limited medications, hygiene kits, diapers and food for those who need a safe place during their ongoing journey. Supplies are also being bought for men and women from Stoyaniv, the village of the Maple Leaf House, who are going to fight in other cities of Ukraine. You see here our van, that came into Poland to buy much needed supplies.



WHAT ARE NASHI'S FUTURE PLANS?

We will continue to purchase supplies, as long as they are needed and upkeep both our girls in Poland and the Maple Leaf House. We are in constant contact with Maria, our director, as we track events day by day. The safety and education of our girls are our primary focus.

The NASHI charity, established in 2004, is focused on preventing young girls from being sex-trafficked and educating Canadians on human trafficking.

We bought a dilapidated building in 2008 and within a few years had an amazing home called the Maple Leaf House. Currently we have 17 girls and have a capacity for 20.

Girls as young as 5 years old are being sold into the sex trade globally. Being brought from corrupt orphanages, broken homes or off the street each of the girls has had a tragic beginning in their precious lives. The Maple Leaf House is now making it possible for the girls to change their lives forever. These girls will be with us on their journey to independence as they complete their education in whatever field they choose.
